## <u>Understanding the World: We are Scientists/ We</u> are Citizens

This term, we will be learning about our local area and comparing it to other locations in the UK and around the world. We'll be exploring and comparing different environments. Investigating why and how maps are used and creating our own to go on our own adventures!

## Literacy: We are Writers

This term, we will be continuing to use the sounds we know to label and begin to make sentences. As we investigate different locations, we will have opportunities to be cartographers and make maps. We will also use our writing skills to label our artwork and constructions of different environments. This term is very exciting as we are building up our knowledge of digraphs so we can use these in our writing.

#### We are Readers

In our phonics lessons, we will continue to learn digraphs (two letters that make one sound 'sh') and trigraphs (three letters that make one sound 'igh'). Please ask your child what the sound of the day is.! We will continue to work on segmenting and blending words. We are doing a big drive on 'Sight Words' so please practise these at home.

### Mathematics: We are Mathematicians

This term, we will continue to develop counting skills, counting larger sets as well as counting actions and sounds. We will explore a range of representations of numbers, including the 10-frame, and see how doubles can be arranged in a 10-frame. We will compare quantities and numbers, including sets of objects which have different attributes and continue to develop a sense of magnitude, e.g. knowing that 8 is quite a lot more than 2, but 4 is only a little bit more than 2.

## Personal, Social & Emotional Development: We are self-aware

This term, we will be growing our diamond power whilst we think about how we can be responsible for making ourselves healthy. We will look at the importance of healthy choices when it comes to food, moving our bodies, sleeping, cleaning ourselves and keeping ourselves safe. We will also continue to be exploring the safeguarding theme of the week.

#### Physical development: We are strong movers

This term, we will continue to strengthen our gross motor skills with lots of obstacle courses as we turn our outside area into different locations on our maps. We will continue to dance in response to music — one of our favourite times to do this is during gem time.

Ask us what our weekly funky finger challenge is. This is a challenge so we can continue to strengthen our fine motor skills. All of this will really help us with our writing where we are continuing to work on our effective pencil grip in preparation for fluent writing. We will refer to this as our 'Tripod Grip' or 'Pincer Fingers'.
