

Understanding the World: We are Scientists

This term, we are exploring the question 'What do animals and plants need to grow?' We will learn about plants and will plant our own bean! We will also be learning about the life cycle of animals and will have the opportunity to meet some real animals and a human baby!



Literacy: We are Writers

This term, we are continuing to use the sounds we know to write words and sentences. We can use our sounds to label our pictures, write sentences about what we have learnt and write signs to support our role play. We now know lots of digraphs (2 letters that make 1 sound) and some trigraphs (3 letters that make one sound) and are learning to independently apply these in our writing.



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We are Readers

In our phonics lessons, we will practise spotting the digraphs and trigraphs that we know in words before we start to sound them out. We are practising reading back sentences after we have sounded out each word. We will try to 'backtrack' to re-read the words we have already sounded out. Reading at home with a grown up is important to build up our stamina for reading longer sentences. Also keep practising the sight word sheets we already know, as well as each new sheet. We are really excited each time we get to take a new sheet home!

Physical development: We are strong movers

This term, we will continue to strengthen our fine motor skills with our weekly Funky Fingers Challenge! This is a challenge that helps strengthen our fingers to help us with our writing. We will use our Pen Power (Point, Pinch, Push, Pencil Power!) to hold our pencil with a 'Tripod Grip' or 'Pincer Fingers'. As the weather continues to get warmer, we will enjoy spending lots of time moving around our outdoor area in the sunshine to strengthen our gross motor skills. We will continue to use all the outdoor resources to create our own games.



Personal, Social & Emotional Development: We are self-aware

This term, we will be growing our diamond power by having the opportunity to be a class monitor. Every child will have opportunities to be responsible for an important job in our classroom and this will help to grow our independence ready for Year 1!

Mathematics: We are Mathematicians

This term, we will continue to practise our counting skills throughout our day, such as when we are tidying things away in our classroom. Lots of our pots have number labels now so we can practise counting out the right number of things into each part of our classroom.



In our maths sessions we will explore and represent number patterns within numbers to 10, including evens and odds and learning our double facts. We will continue to explore the composition of numbers to 10 using various representations such as 10 frames. We will begin to develop a sense of magnitude when comparing numbers, for example, knowing that 8 is quite a lot more than 2, but 4 is only a little bit more than 2.
