Anti-Bullying Week

Last week, we celebrated *Anti-Bullying Week* by wearing Odd Socks. In Monday's assembly we talked about how wearing odd socks was to celebrate what makes us all unique. We also talked about what 'bullying' is, defining it as: hurting somebody several times on purpose. We talked about how bullying can happen in person or online. This year's *Anti-Bullying Week* theme was 'Reach Out'. We spent time talking to the children about ways to speak up about bullying – even if it is not them who is being bullied. At Begbrook, children can tell an adult in person or use the class Chatterbox

We have updated our Anti-Bullying information leaflet for children, which can be found in the main school office, and we have been very impressed with all the Anti-Bullying posters and information leaflets that have been created by the children.

This week, as part of Road Safety Week, we have been talking to children about how vehicles can be safer on the roads, how all people should be wearing seatbelts whilst travelling in vehicles and how we can keep safe when crossing a road. We also asked the children to think about how the roads around Begbrook could be safer – especially at the beginning and end of the day. So far, the child have suggested the following ideas:

- 'Put a gate around the road'
- 'More lollipop mans'
- 'On the little poles outside the school, there can be posters or reminders that say look, stop, cross'

We look forward to receiving more ideas from children that we can talk about over the next couple of weeks.

Online Safety Advice

Most social media apps require users to be at least 13 years old. Recently at Begbrook, we have been supporting children in upper key stage 2 (years 4, 5 and 6) to manage difficulties between friends via social media platforms. If your child is currently on social media, or if they've been asking to join, it's important to talk to them about what social media is, what rules you have for it and how to be safe whilst using social media.
